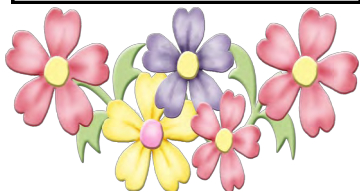

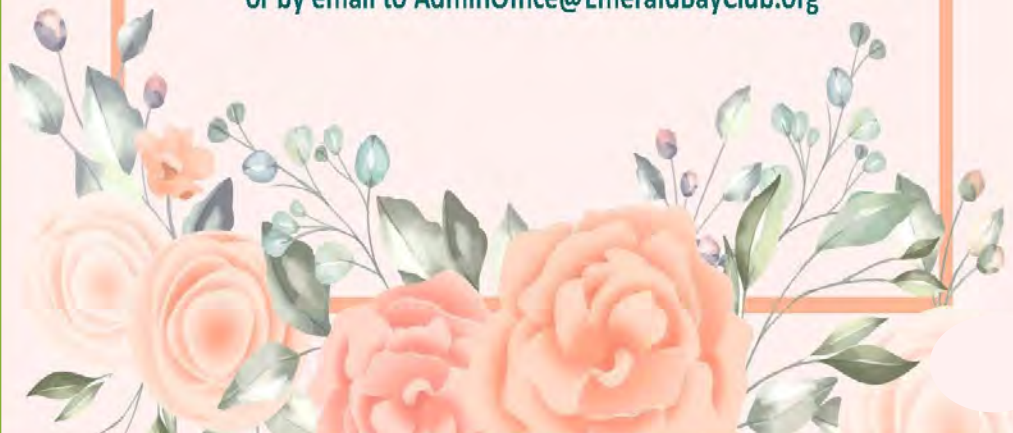

The HOA Financial Summary for March shows revenue of \$42,066 reflecting a negative variance to budget of \$1,093 which is related primarily to timing of receiving the cable franchise income of \$2,662 in February. Expenses of \$42,757 were over budget by \$3,251 related to payroll expense overage of \$2,765, and postage expense of \$1,738. The net operating shows a negative variance of \$4,444. Total Cash on Hand is \$176,750 with the Capital Funds Balance of \$129,810 including reserves. Both are strong for the HOA.

The committee did not meet this month. We are researching matters brought to our attention and will be further reporting in coming months.

PLANNING & BYLAWS**SETH SULLIVAN**

Our committee is working on items brought to our attention through public comment at past Board meetings. Our “pet restraint” definition is being addressed following reports and public comments of various issues throughout the community. Our committee has decided to conduct a survey to our membership as it has been a few years since the Board has done so. This will help us determine priorities for the entire community, so please take time to respond.

PROPERTY COMPLIANCE**ANNETTE BURRHUS-CLAY**

Just a reminder parking cars, trucks, heavy equipment and trailers on your lawn is not allowed. This is not an allowable parking arrangement for hours or for days. We have had fewer pet issues complaints this month but still not complete compliance. It would be appreciated if folks put energy into keeping their pets safe and neighbors comfortable rather than looking for ways to stretch every current rule about leashes. Additionally, we are also getting complaints about cats wandering into yards, digging up plants, using flowerbeds as litter boxes, etc. Remember the rules specify “pets”, so cats are not free-range animals in the community. With construction projects it appears a few construction projects have stalled out for months, without any progress. If your project is being significantly delayed, stopped, incomplete, etc., you cannot leave porta-potties and building materials sitting in your yards and driveways indefinitely. Please update the office on what’s happening so we can reasonably access whether this is a situation that requires patience and empathy for the homeowner or compassion and action for your neighbors.

ENGINEERING – NO REPORT**KEITH KIRKPATRICK****SECURITY****ANNETTE BURRHUS-CLAY**

The radar sign is now fully functioning with a monitor showing your speed. Since April 2nd, data prior to the monitor showing your speed resulted in a total of 394 speeding incidents when stationed in front of the clubhouse from April 2nd through the 17th. The first 11 days since, we had the radar stationed near the tennis court netted another 49 speeders. I believe this data solidifies the reality that EB does have a speeding problem. We will continue to monitor speeding for a “grace” period through Mother’s Day with no tickets being issued. Beginning Monday, May 12th we will begin issuing tickets for speeding infractions per the HOA fine policy. Please share this information with your neighbors, guests, and vendors. We hope this brief grace period will be used to get back into the habit of driving at 25 mph or slower. If we can all make a concerted effort to slow down, we will all be safer for it. This past month has unfortunately included some emergency situations that we thankfully don’t experience often. Thank you, security, for assisting first responders in these instances and thank you to our neighbors for showing your concern from a safe and respectful distance. A friendly reminder that children under 14 should not be driving golf carts if not accompanied by an adult.

Seth Sullivan commented that the Emerald Bay Friends Facebook page is in no way sanctioned or endorsed by the HOA or Club and some of the bigotry posted will not be tolerated and thanks to whoever quickly deleted a recent offensive post. Annette Clay commented that the speed monitor added to the ticket trailer has had the desired effect as the number of speeders has decreased dramatically. Scott Hagy explained that it is an amenity and the EB subsidy for F & B is 8.6% of dues while the national average is over 13%. Becca Wilson and Annette Clay both mentioned that it’s the same as the tennis court and other amenities and will always be an expense.

In March, total revenue of \$303,068 was under budget by \$672. Total expenses for the month came in at \$280,305, which is \$2,562 over budget. This is related to the timing of our service contract renewal for our irrigation system of \$3,800. We have this amount budgeted in April and will realize the savings then. Net operating YTD actual is at \$52,673, which is \$70,356 ahead of budget. Total Operating Cash on Hand is good at \$176,822 and capital funds are strong at \$990,783.
