The HOA Financial Summary for April shows revenue of \$38,609 reflecting a negative variance to budget of \$2,633. This is related to the timing of our cable franchise quarterly payment, which we should realize in May. Expenses of \$37,635 were over budget by \$1,207, related primarily to the timing of technology expense. The net operating line shows a negative variance of \$3,840. Year to date total net operating is \$12,658 over budget. Total Cash on Hand is \$184,414 and the Capital Funds Balance is \$110,517 both are strong for the HOA.

In April, total revenue of \$294,359 was over budget by \$10,871. This is primarily related to a surplus in Proshop revenue of \$11,159 in merchandise sales, administration revenue of \$825, in advertising and earned interest. Total expenses for the month came in at \$285,817 which is \$31,436 over budget. This is related to golf course expenses with the timing of our fertilizer and chemical expenses of \$16,302, contract labor for tree removal of \$7,257, Irrigation repairs of \$4,337, and fuel expense of \$3,256. Net operating p/l came in under budget \$14,953 for the month. Year to date net operating is over budget by \$36,092. Total Operating Cash on Hand is good at \$297,793 and capital funds are strong at \$950,672. Emerald Bay Club is financially sound.

In the golf shop, Alex reports that Pete has taken a new position that will enhance his wanted profession in the medical field. He will be sorely missed. On the flip side, Caden who was with us last summer will be joining us once he returns from competing with La Tourneau University golf team at Nationals. Golf shop sales were strong last month and should exceed the budget by \$10,000 or more. The only issues the shop is experiencing is members and their guests not checking in, and shirts remaining tucked in on the golf course.

On the basketball court, warranty repairs have been completed, and the striping should be finished soon. The pool has opened for the weekends and will return to normal hours beginning May 31<sup>st</sup>. If you are planning to use the pool this year, you must fill out the swimming pool release form. Women of Courage serve to increase awareness, promote prevention, and strengthen coordination efforts. Our Emerald Bay Benevolence Foundation's goal is to assist in crisis and enable people to become self-reliant. We answer calls for individual needs and partner with local relief agencies by providing some funding as they provide services for our clients. Since we are an IRS-approved charity, all donations are tax-deductible.

Since 2020, the Emerald Bay Benevolence Foundation has provided financial support for the Children's Advocacy Center of Smith County (CACSC). The EBBF supports the celebration of 25 years that the CACSC has protected and restored the lives of thousands of abused children through team investigations, healing services, community outreach, and strategic partnerships. Last year, the CACSC interviewed 1,034 children who were suspected of being physically abused, sexually abused or witnessed a violent crime. Once the interview is complete, the CACSC surrounds the child with emergency resources, medical exams, and trauma-focused therapy, all at no cost to the child. Because over half of abused children never tell, the CACSC also provides education programs in schools, including body safety presentations for children and trauma-informed training for educators. With the number of vulnerable children growing, the Children's Advocacy Center is grateful to partner with the Emerald Bay Benevolence Foundation to make sure every child receives the help they need to be heard, believed, and helped.
