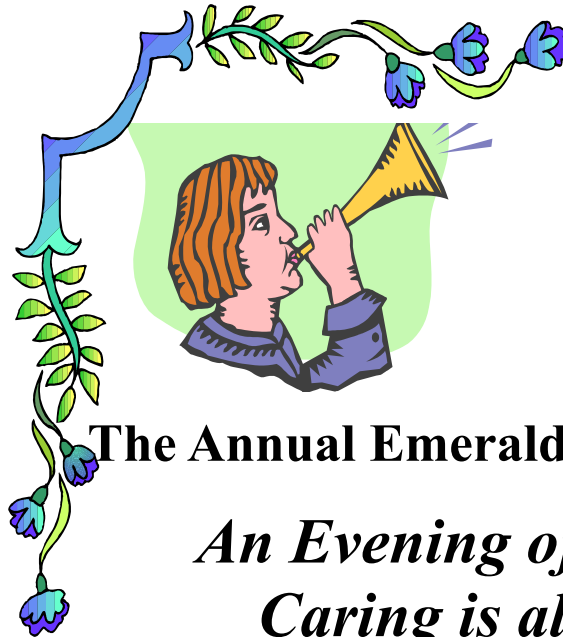

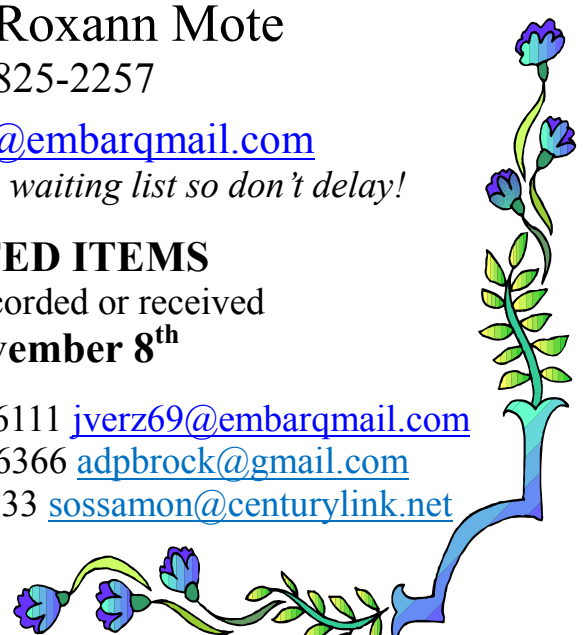
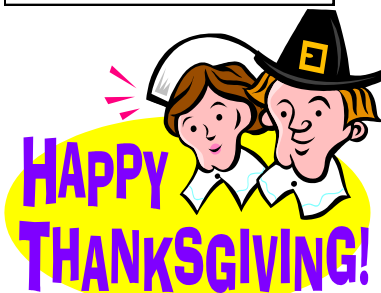

EMERALD BAY HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION**MONTHLY BOARD MEETING MINUTES****OCTOBER 16, 2014**

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors of the Emerald Bay Homeowners Association was held at the Emerald Bay Clubhouse, Smith County, Texas, on October 16, 2014. President David Terry called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

All Directors were present except Fred Zachary and Jim Wright, whose absences were excused. There were 18 members present.

The opening prayer was offered by Carl Smith.

The President then asked if there were additions or corrections to the Minutes of the Board of Directors, September 18, 2014, as published in THE RAINBOW REVIEW. As there were none, the minutes were approved as published.

TREASURER'S REPORT**EDD CLARK**

Please refer to the financial summary. Our cash on hand is \$315,045 which includes our front gate escrow funds. Our monthly and YTD revenue is up \$56,077. Our actual expenses are within actual revenue for the month. Our Capital funds stand at \$125,346 thru September.

OLD BUSINESS**NONE****NEW BUSINESS****JOHN CORDOVA**

A. I move that authorization be given to the Engineering Committee to spend up to \$30,000, subject to our three bid requirement for the expansion and remodeling of the guardhouse.

The motion was seconded by Barry Sossamon.

The motion passed five for with one against.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:**ARCHITECTURE****JIM WRIGHT**

The following are items large and small that have been brought to my attention: member replaced a door and rotten wood, addition to pool and cabana, and visited a site that was pouring concrete for a new home.

MOWING**JIM WRIGHT**

I had a home under foreclosure mowed, visited with member and asked BK mowing to trim limbs at a home on South Bay that was on a curve that created a potential problem. I made contact with a member and asked that a low over hanging limb be cut. Our bylaws state that trees need to be trimmed to 15 feet that are over the road.

ENGINEERING**JOHN CORDOVA**

As you may have noticed, we have begun work on the Front Gate project! Barring any unforeseen obstacles and/or rain delays, the widening of the entrance area is projected to have a completion date of November 14, 2014. Just to be clear, this is just the removal of the existing North wall, rebuilding conduit and electrical lines under the pavement and paving the newly acquired area.

During this construction phase, we are requesting members drive slowly and with caution through the guard house area watching for workers and equipment. There will be times when we will be down to one lane for the entry. Hopefully, this will not be for more than a day or two. We will coordinate with Security so they may inform the membership ahead of time when there will be a lane closure and work to move traffic in a safe and expeditious manner. Your patience during this time will be greatly appreciated.

As we near completion of widening the entry area, we hope to begin the guardhouse expansion and renovation. We are in the bid phase.

Security statistics report submitted for inclusion in the October Board Minutes. Highlights include the issue of 3 speeding citations, one case of property damage by vandalism and one case of suspected theft.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Please refer to the financial summary. Cash on hand, total operating is \$234,010 plus capital for a total cash of \$857,042. Please note the capital reserve allocations. In Operating, we are up for the month and also YTD in revenue compared to budget. Our actual expenses for the month and YTD is also up. We have had non-budgeted expenses and unexpected shortfalls in all departments. It appears that this is and will be a challenging year ending. We have had three new home sales for \$30,000. Capital stands at \$623,032 with one refund. Our delinquencies are being maintained to a minimum as much as the law will allow us. Thank you for your support in our expansions and growth.

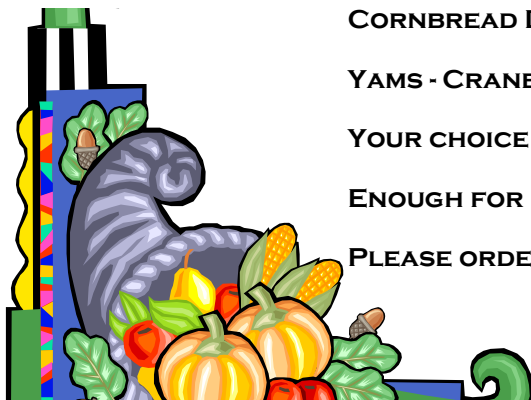

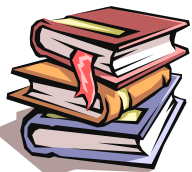
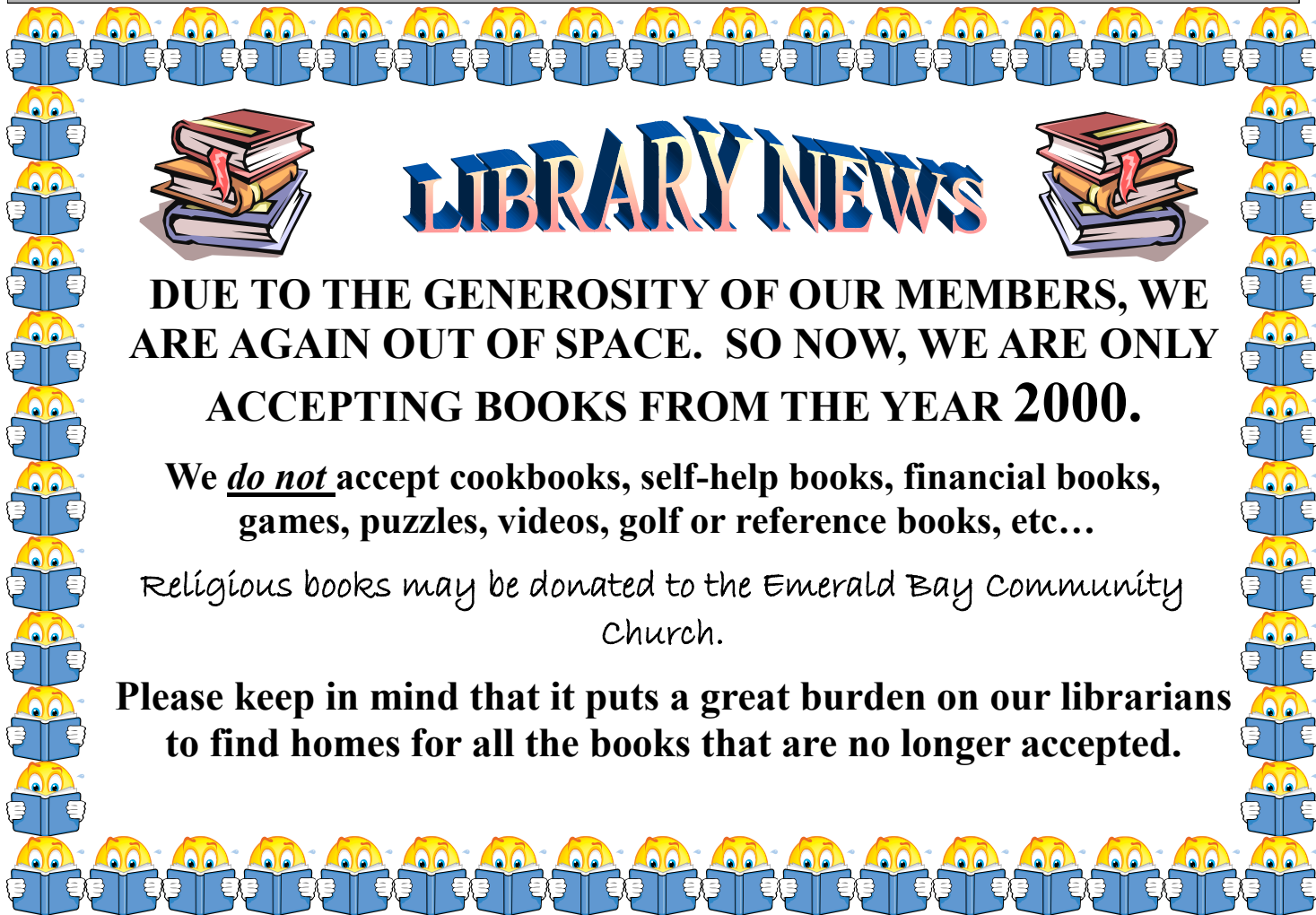

Information on Front Gate Project

As you may have noticed, we are in the process of expanding and improving the front entrance and guardhouse. The north wall will be moved twenty-three feet further away from the guardhouse, with the right hand entry lane also moved over next to the north wall. The right lane will be separated by fifteen feet from the existing lane and will be marked by removable upright posts.

When the project is fully completed, vehicles that have been using the right hand lane will continue to use the right hand lane via an automated Registered Access Gate. The lane closest to the guard house will continue to be used in the same manner as in the past. The Registered Access Gate lane will be available for use by registered Emerald Bay Members, employees, registered guests on members' authorized lists, registered vendors and registered service providers authorized by members.

The new Registered Access Gate will utilize Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology allowing the gate to open automatically when receiving a signal from an authorized RFID tag. RFID tags come in different forms. After surveying the Emerald Bay membership, we determined that over 75% of the members already have Texas Toll tags (TXTag, NTTA Toll Tag, EZPass, TxDot) on their vehicles. Therefore, we have elected to use these tags for individual registration and use in our system to activate the Registered Access Gate.

Recognizing that not everyone has a toll tag, we are asking people who don't already have a toll tag to apply and get one if they want to use the Registered Access Lane. For people who for some reason do not want to apply for and get a toll tag, the existing lane passing next to the guard house, manned by the guard, will still be available for entry.

Only toll tags that have been registered in our database will open the Registered Access Gate. Someone driving in with a tag not registered with us will not be able to activate the gate. In the next few weeks we will be building the database and will ask each member to give us the digital number printed on their toll tags. We will send out instructions showing where to find the number on your tags. Each vehicle that you want to be able to activate the gate will need a toll tag which has been registered with us.

If you want guests on your authorized guest list to have automated access, you will be able to give us their toll tag numbers as well. Using this same process, we will make the Registered Access Gate available to Emerald Bay employees, regular contractors and vendors, health care providers, and any other vehicles authorized by a member. We will be giving everyone instructions on how to accomplish this. However, our first priority will be to implement the system for use by our members.

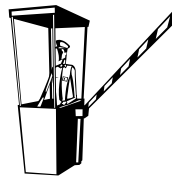
There will be no charge to your toll tag account from the state or from us to use toll tags for entrance into Emerald Bay. When using your toll tag for normal travel on public toll roads, your toll tag account will still function normally.

If you don't have a toll tag and want to get one for use on our Registered Access Gate, they can be obtained on-line from (txtag.org), (ntta.org) or (www.hctra.org). In the next few weeks we will be offering assistance to anyone needing help in applying for a toll tag. Again, for those who don't have a toll tag, the existing lane next to the guard house will still be manned and available for use by members, visitors, vendors and others needing to check in through the guard gate. Those using this lane will, however, have to wait in line along with any others waiting to pass by the guard.

The purpose of the front gate expansion is to expedite a safer entrance into Emerald Bay while still providing the controlled access and security we have all come to expect. Separation of the lanes and thus a wider turning radius for large vehicles should make the entrance safer and less congested. The project is also designed to improve the guard house conditions for our guards. We will still have the same number of security personnel on duty. Although after a few weeks, much of the construction and equipment will be in place, it will not be fully put into use until after the completion of the remodeling of the guard house. During construction there will be a few days in which traffic may be confined to one lane.

As with any change, I'm sure there will be issues that will arise and problems to iron out. Your assistance and patience will certainly be appreciated and help make it an easier transition.

ARE YOU PREPARED?

FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) reminds us that disasters are occurring with greater frequency and are larger and more complex. There are critical steps we need to take to be ready if and when a disaster strikes. These can be managed one step at a time, beginning with an emergency supply kit, a family emergency plan and information about the different types of emergencies and their appropriate responses.

RECOMMENDED ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN BASIC SUPPLY KIT

One gallon of water per person per day for at least 3 days

At least a three day supply of non-perishable food

Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries

Flashlight and extra batteries

First aid kit

Whistle to signal for help

Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place

Moist hand wipes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation

Can opener for food

Local maps

Prescription medications and glasses

Infant formula and diapers

Pet food and extra water for your pet

Important family documentation such as copies of insurance policies (home, car, medical) proof of ownership (title, mortgage) identification, SS#, bank account records in a waterproof, portable container and originals in a safety deposit box (key in container with copies)

Cash or traveler's checks and change

First aid book

Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person

Complete change of clothing including a long sleeve shirt and long pants and sturdy shoes

Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper to disinfect water

Fire extinguisher

Matches in a waterproof container

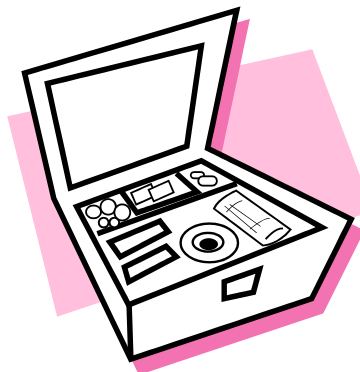

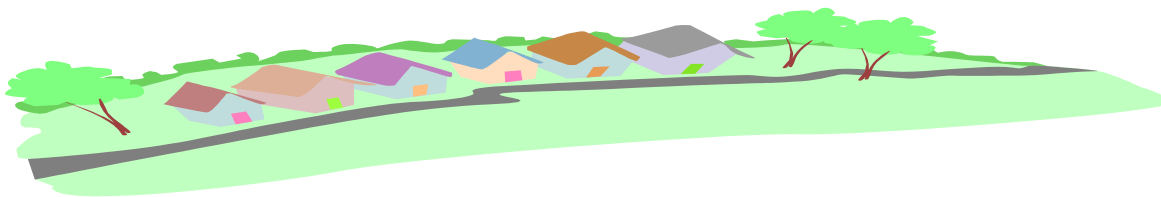

A Trip to Clute, TX

Yes, my friends, there is a Clute in Texas, and it is located about 50 miles south of Houston. Clute is the location of the Gulf Coast Bird Observatory (GCBO). The GCBO is a layover area for migrating birds. It happens to be a major stopover for ruby-throated hummingbirds migrating to their southern wintering grounds. The White family including daughter Susan and grandson Jackson traveled to Clute to see the birds and observe the banding.

The facility there sets up the second and third Saturdays of September 8 a.m. to noon to band the migratory birds and the public is welcome to observe the process. As a bonus, you may adopt a hummingbird by contributing \$20 (gulp) then you may sit next to the bander and watch as he goes through his routine. The birds are caught at various feeding stations by the use of nylon mist nets. They are then collected and placed in small net bags and delivered to the bander. He then very carefully fits a small aluminum leg band with unique number provided by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

During this process the bander weighs, determines the sex, age, and general physical condition of the bird. Weight of the hummers averages 3 grams or 1/8 of an ounce. Finally the bird is placed in the open hand of the adopter who then gently nudges the hummer as it speeds away, none the worse for wear. The observer is then presented with a certificate documenting the number of his bird.

Warren's bird has been caught three times four days apart. Warren received a phone call letting him know his bird is doing well and is still in the Clute area.
